You don't always need specialist knowledge to break codes but you do need certain skills, many of which can be developed with practise and are also vitally important to navigating everyday life, learning and future employment. This activity is designed to test and develop your problem solving skills, imagination, logic skill, critical thinking, perseverance, language skills, mathematical skills, resilience, patience, patience and planning skills.

Activity: Film Making **2 day activity

This is a school-based activity in which you will plan, story-board, film and edit a 30-1 min second teaser trailer for a film genre which creates a series of narrative enigma codes (mysteries). The following is an example of what the days may look like:

DAY ONE

- · Plan the overall plot of your film what sub-genre of film do you want to make? Mainstream or Independent? What is roughly going to happen?
- · Storyboard your trailer consider a range of different camera angles and sounds. How are you going to show snippets of your film without giving away the whole plot?
- · Film your trailer using props, make-up and lighting. You may bring in props from home.

DAY TWO

· Edit your footage and create a 30 second teaser trailer ready for showcasing at the end of the day

Activity: Gym & Well Being Day

GYM and WELL BEING DAY at the Watson Gym Frome. State of the art gym, best equipment in the industry. Students to plan gym session in the morning in a classroom at JOG after guidance speech/powerpoint from Mr Smith. Students will look into how to make training and meal plans, and then make healthy smoothies as a pre gym meal. Students will make protein flapjacks which will be refrigerated for after our session.

Go to Watson Gym, Frome to carry out planned workouts. Students will complete a spin class at the Watson Gym and have time to use the weights area. Return to school to focus on Well Being with Yoga and Stretching session followed by a classroom session based on recovery, using massage guns, foam rollers etc. Lastly, students will enhance their recovery by eating protein flapjacks at JOG.

Students will undertake a walk of approximately 10 miles in the local area over the course of the entire school day. This will be using footpaths, tracks, towpaths and some smaller roads and then having a long lunch break in a scenic spot. We will visit local rivers, canals and woodland and explore paths around Bradford-on-Avon, Tellisford, Avoncliff and Rode. Students will need to ensure they have suitable footwear for walking in mud and over a long distance. They should also be prepared for extremely hot, wet or cold weather. A good packed lunch and snacks for the walk will be required and at least 1 litre of water, 2 if the weather is hot

Fancy yourself as the next Lewis Hamilton??? All the gear but no idea? Why not come and learn how to be a racing driver. Come and experience full training on: Racing lines(the fastest route), how to set up a race car, defensive driving, overtaking, health and safety then put all that into practice with 3 timed 10 minute sessions at M4 Karting with a certificate for completion of JOG Racing School and trophy for fastest time of the day.
